6. Funding Requests for 2019/2020

- a. Replacement of play shed in the far corner of the field (opposite to the Forest School area). An old play shed from the reception area was there which the children thoroughly enjoyed but it has since had to be removed due to poor condition. Therefore a new play shed in that same space would be well used. Mrs Mills shared some possible ideas (attached) and *Emma/Gemma will make further enquiries and feedback at next meeting*.
- b. Replacement of former stage area adjacent to PE sheds. This area had a stage space on it but this has been removed and the space could be better used by the addition of a gazebo-style covered structure. Mrs Mills shared some possible ideas (attached). A concrete base would be needed, and this was likened to a similar outside seating gazebo in Laurence Park, Thurlby. *Emma/Gemma will make further enquiries and feedback at next meeting*.
- c. 4 raised gardening beds to be constructed behind the Mobile classrooms with flagstone walkways between each one. This would allow children to plant and tend to new crops, providing learning activities to understand their local farming area. Crops grown could then be harvested and used for cooking, e.g. wheat to make bread, activities within school. *Emma will make further enquiries regarding pricing and feedback at next meeting*.

7. Library Bus – Funding and Books

Discussion was held regarding stocking the library bus with books from Peter's - a book wholesaler linked directly to publishers, who also have barcoding capabilities. This continues as lists of titles are reviewed for relevance and interest in relation to funds available. Regarding the existing funds available for the bus and books, it was planned that of the £8,200 available, £7,000 would be used for purchasing books, and associated equipment e.g. dust covers, and the remaining £1,200 would be retained as a contingency fund for bus maintenance.

The maintenance of the bus would be the responsibility of the school. Miss Loom is the school reading champion and plans are in place for appropriate community/parent reading buddies and Miss Loom to act as bus librarians. *Emma will investigate book and shelf labelling*.

Thomas Cook had previously shown interest in financially contributing to the bus but this has yet to be completed. *Emma will follow up on this matter*.

8. Tuck Shop

5/6 new volunteers have been added to the rota this term, continuing rotation of seasonal fruit supplies to provide variation of what is offered.

We are very lucky to help provide our children's school with not only educational extras but also the fun things that help make the children's time at Baston School a little bit more memorable, from the ice lolly on a hot day, party day, different sports to try, a gingerbread friend when they start through to a leavers book full of friends and memories made 7 years later.

All these extras are only achievable because of the commitment of the PTA team, teachers, friends and family supporting events such as the Disco, movie nights, fayres and gift stalls to name just a few events!

I look forward to seeing what we can do this year on Mrs Mills wish list and what new ideas we can come up with, to keep raising funds to make the education fun for all the children at Baston School.

Our school budget remains incredibly tight and many schools alongside ours are having to make cuts in staffing and resources. We have very strong leadership through the governance of our school and so such financial constraints are well-managed and planned for wherever possible. Perhaps because of this we do not have to make quite such radical changes as our neighbours - but we are by no means exempt. For example, you may notice we have not employed additional staff to man the gate in the mornings since Mrs Goddard's departure. Mrs Dickson and I have added this to our daily duties.

It is in these times of hardship (sadly likely to get worse) that the work of the PTA and the additional funds you provide become even more important to us.

Baston C of E Primary School P.T.A Annual General Meeting 11th September 2019 Treasurers Report

It has been an incredibly successful year of fundraising for the PTA.

During the Financial year to 31/08/19 the total income generated from fundraising activities was £39,852.91 with expenditure of £38,965.70 thus making a small profit of £887.21. However we had a rather exceptional year where the PTA took on the challenge of acquiring a double decker bus and turning it into a Library bus. Through grants and donations we raised a massive £30,203.80 plus the £9000 PTA pledged and the project expenditure was £30,614.08 so we still have £8,589.72 to spend on Books!

Our bank balance at the 31st August 2019 is £9,493.87. We have £2764 to clear in September giving us £12,257.87. Keeping £8,589.72 for the Bus profit to be spent on books, £3,668.15 is left for the PTA.

Income

We held an early event in October to try and attract new families/members to the PTA by holding a Quiz night. This raised a profit of £207.87.

Also during the second term we ran a new fundraising scheme called £100 Square, where 100 squares are sold for a £1 and the winning square receives £100 and the PTA keeps £100.

We ran with the Christmas Card/Mug fundraising scheme after last year success and raised £278.37 so a big thanks to Rebecca Amos for organising this.

The PTA ran more discos this year (5 to be exact) and raised a massive £1882.58.

We continued with the new approach of providing refreshments at the Christmas productions and Sports day and included the Easter production this year too. Nativity and Christingle raised £108.50, Easter £43.00 and Sports day £198.16 deducting the cost of the cups/tea/coffee/milk etc. the overall combined profit was £301.90

A big fundraising event this year was our "sponsored Read" we were able to raise £2070.04 and as this is a sponsored event we were able to apply for gift aid from HMRC – to date we are still awaiting the value and payment from HMRC.

As usual, the main sources of income Xmas Raffle (690.02), Xmas Fair (810.10), Bus Opening/Summer Fair (443.65), Film Night (242.62), Gift Stalls (893.49), Cake Raffle (320.83), Organised Mum (64.74), Easy Fundraising (15.76), 2nd hand Uniform (57.00), Label Planet (106.95), Bags 2 School (296.00), Water Bottles (5.00) and Tuck shop (321.11). This is a reduction from previous years, mainly due to procuring new cups with stick on PTA labels (this is part of a new venture with the school to be more plastic aware and help reduce our plastic waste), however the overall income from tuckshop is lower this year.

Expenditure

The PTA was able to spend and donate £3,938.03 on the children and items for the School.

This financial year also gave the PTA the opportunity to support 'Children in Need' via a cake tuck shop. We were able to make a Donation of £102.00 to Children in need.

We repaired our PTA Storage Shed, which is located within the School's grounds. The work was carried out over the summer holidays and the cost of labour fell into this year's accounts of £250 as per mentioned in last years report

The last of the Lottery Grant £548 was spent with Finding Fitness. 2 and half days of sports was organised in May.

We covered the cost of DBS checking all PTA Members - £100

Wind-breaks and Gazebo £155.97

4 x New PTA Shirts £55.96

These accounts are currently with the independent Examiner and I would like to thank Jonathan Reichelt for auditing the accounts. I hope to have them signed off shortly.

In the coming year we hope to continue supporting the school and the children with some interesting but less challenging projects and activities than last year, and as always the continued support of the parents is vital in our fundraising efforts and we can not express especially with the support we have received over this year how gratefully appreciated it is to us and the school.
