School Disco

You should have received a letter providing details of the school disco on Thursday 15th December. Please return your consent form and fee to the school office by Friday 9th December. Tickets will be sent out in the week beginning Monday 12th December. We have listened to feedback from parents and understand that our decision to not allow pre-schoolers into the main disco has caused some disappointment. We have therefore reviewed this and decided that pre-schoolers aged over 3 years will be permitted into the main hall, but must be under the close supervision of their parent/guardian. We realise that many of these children will be coming to the school in September and this is a good opportunity for them to help settle in.

How are funds spent by the BSA?

All funds raised by the BSA are used to fund educational items/activities that will be of benefit for the children in the school. We aim to distribute the money evenly and fairly across all year groups. For the 16/17 school year the BSA have decided to initially donate £200 to each year group to be put towards curriculum enrichment activities. Typical ways to spend this money

may include subsidised school trips, inviting subject matter experts into their class, or purchasing classroom equipment. We will let you know how each year group has decided to spend this money in future newsletters.

The BSA also hope to provide funding for the library and to help with refurbishment of the outside woodland area. The more money we can raise, the more we can donate.
