Dear Parents, Carers and Governors,

It was so lovely to see so many of you at stay and read this week. If you would like to become a regular reading volunteer, please let either school office know; we would love you to!

The Reception children have made an excellent start to school and have been very settled and enjoying exploring the building and making new friends.

We were delighted to raise £2,352.85 for GOSH with our spellathon last term. This half term we would like to raise money for a local charity called CHOAS. <https://www.chaoscharity.org/> CHOAS (Children's Holidays and Other Specialties) was established in 1976 and is small, registered charity ran solely by volunteers and based in East London, (Registered Charity No: 281609). CHOAS provide free summer holiday camps to children who are referred from their school, and who would not otherwise be receiving a holiday that year. We regularly send our children on holiday through CHOAS. On the last day before the half term holiday, on Friday 19th October, the children can come in non-uniform in return for a donation to CHOAS, suggested donation £1. There will be buckets on the door as the children come in to school to collect the donations. It is a fantastic local charity and some of our ex-pupils go on to be volunteers as young adults too.

Our new advisor from the diocese, Mrs Carrie Prior visited school on Tuesday this week. In her report she wrote, "School in a positive place following on from the successful LA Review conducted by a lead Ofsted inspector in the summer. The Data set for 2018 is very good. The learning environment is well organised and effective following on from building works over the summer holidays. The Senior Leadership Team are experienced and in a strong position. There was a calm and productive atmosphere in all classrooms and around both school sites. Learning behaviours were very strong."
