### Wow, What a Year!

Last September, it was hard to feel optimistic about the potential for fundraising and events in 2020/21. With so much uncertainty and the threat of a second wave, our capacity to adapt to the challenges of socially distanced fundraising was truly tested. However, we were determined to still make it a year to remember for all the right reasons; funding equipment and resources for the school and providing amazing opportunities for the children.

At the start of the school year, our fundraising target was £15,000. At the time of writing, we have achieved an astounding

£19,845

In addition to this, we have secured grants worth £24,243. These grants have enabled us to fund books for KS2, laptops and SEN equipment, a rainwater harvesting system for the polytunnel, and have contributed to the installation of the Elemental Arena and the ongoing playground improvement project.

### **Trails and Tribulations**

Thanks to Covid-19, 2020/21 has been the year of the trail. We sought out pumpkins, searched for a pesky elf and hunted for rabbits - but that's not all!

Non-uniform days had a dash of difference, a festive twist and got sporty.

Rather than our traditional Christmas fair, we sold wooden snowmen, reindeer and a host of other handmade items and gifts at our online Christmas Market. Our Christmas raffle and silent auction went online as well, and we delivered some festive magic to the children in the form of letters from Santa.

Our second virtual balloon race took to the skies from Paris, and made for an exciting February half term, tracking the balloons across the English Channel and onwards towards Scandinavia.

More recently, we challenged our school community to complete a 5k in May challenge and gain sponsorship for doing it. 46 participants completed their running, walking, scooting, cycling or football-kicking, and were awarded with a special medal.

Also in May, the children were given sunflowers to plant. We look forward to seeing how well they grow!

As well as a time of change, this year has been a time of reflection too. Our photo exhibition encouraged the children to provide images illustrating their experience of lockdown. The photos were made into a video presentation (still available at <a href="https://youtu.be/S\_N8HXoN23k">https://youtu.be/S\_N8HXoN23k</a>) and used as a discussion point in school.









### **The Great Outdoors**

With the schools' continued drive to promote outdoor learning for all year groups, we have been tackling the garden and polytunnel areas with renewed energy this year.

One of the grants we obtained was for a rainwater harvesting system for the polytunnel, so this has been fitted, and the beds planted with flower bulbs and vegetable seeds. We have recently harvested a great deal of onions, garlic and kale, as well as potatoes, peas and beans!



As well as working in the polytunnel, a regular 'gardening club' of PTA committee members and other volunteers has been working on the flower beds, attempting to keep them well tended.

Our volunteers have been working on the outdoor learning areas too, supplementing the existing resources with mud kitchens, upcycled tables and stools, a water wall, and other equipment. This was made possible thanks to a monetary donation from The Star, Lingfield.

Away from the outdoor learning areas, our main fundraising focus this year has been on playground improvements. After the installation of the Elemental Arena, we have embarked on an ambitious playground improvement project, details of which can be found here: https://tinyurl.com/PlaygroundImprovementPlan.

Thanks to grants from East Grinstead Memorial Estate and Southover Manor Trust, as well as funds raised at the Sporty Non-Uniform Day, work on phase 1 will be able to commence in October 2021.
